

POLICY

PRIVATE TUTORING

The Holmdel Township Board of Education expects that every effort will be made by the administration and teachers to help each child with his/her difficulties at school before recommending that parents/guardians engage a tutor.

However, should individual tutoring be recommended in exceptional cases, the Superintendent shall establish such rules as will protect both the school system and the teachers from charges of conflict of interest.

Teachers shall not tutor, for a fee, pupils enrolled in their classes or upon whose evaluation or assignment they may be called upon to pass. No employee of the Board may make a commitment to perform services for extra pay when he/she has been instrumental in recommending the need for those services.

Teachers shall not tutor any pupil for pay during regular working hours or on school premises.
