

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND HEALTH

Physical education and athletic activities are recognized as necessary components of a comprehensive educational program. Each pupil enrolled in the school district will be required to participate in the health and physical education program during the regular school day in accordance with state law and regulation as well as with district policy.

The Holmdel Township Board of Education directs that the district's curricular and extracurricular programs of physical education and activities comply with the district's affirmative action policies and plan for school and classroom practices as stipulated in policies 5145.4, and 6121 in this manual.

In general, physical education classes shall not be divided on the basis of sex. The quality and quantity of teachers, equipment and facilities shall be equivalent among the schools and comparable from level to level, taking into account the needs of the pupils.
