K. Report of the Superintendent

Good Evening Members of the Board, Administrators, staff and community members in attendance tonight.

There is a lot going on in the district. Today, was actually National Administrative Professional's Day. Those are the folks who work in our offices and support the Administration, the teachers and the students, so I just wanted to take an opportunity to publicly thank them for all of the work they do, which is obviously very critical to accomplishing our mission on a daily basis, so your efforts and your service is appreciated.

Some congratulations are in order to our High School Girls Golf Team, who won the Monmouth County Title as well as the Shore Conference Title. In fact, two Holmdel golfers finished in the top two places in the Shore Conference Tournament and actually were tied and had to go into a sudden death playoff. Those golfers were Sirina Ganne and Minna Liang, who finished tied for first with scores of 76 (+4) over par... great scores! (Wish I could shoot a 76!) I just wanted to congratulate Coach Kathy Bradley as well as the other members of the team, Alexandra Schaul, Karoline Geslak and Olivia Kim on an outstanding accomplishment.

Thank you to Mr. Reddy for bringing it to my attention that our Boys Golf Team had a pretty solid outing at the Shore Conference Tournament, as well, finishing third and giving CBA all they can handle. So congratulations to the Boys on an outstanding effort there as well.

Last Friday, I had the pleasure and privilege of attending the Indian Hill spring musical, Newsies Jr. Mr. DiMare was in attendance as well, as his son was in the stage crew. The kids did an amazing job and the staff advisors, Ms. Nigro and Ms. Sparacino, were just absolutely tremendous. They had approximately 150 kids involved in that production from actors to stage crew and, of course, we could not have done that also without the support of a lot of parent volunteers. Such a great show and, if you haven't gotten out to see an Indian Hill musical, I strongly encourage you to. It was a lot of fun.

This is actually a good tangent into going back to the Holmdel Foundation for Educational Excellence and the Gala on Saturday night. My wife and I were in attendance, along with Board Member DiMare, Board Member Mann, President Reddy and Vice President Wall were also in attendance. The gift, as you may know, the HFEE does an annual gift and this year's annual gift will be to partner with the school district in the total renovation of Mrs. McCarthy's Indian Hill music room. For those of you who don't know Mrs. McCarthy, she has been a music teacher in the district for over 20 years, is an absolute superstar and we're really excited to be able to completely refresh and modernize that room with new instruments, new storage, cabinetry, acoustic ceiling and wall panels, new technology and really I think at a time when our community continues to express their aspiration and a desire for us to continue investing in the arts, it comes at a great time as well as ensures that we have outstanding music education that continues for years into the future. We are looking forward to our first project planning meeting on Friday and we'll commence work on that, in earnest, over the summer.

This morning, I was invited by High School Teacher, Mr. Chang, who teaches the AP Seminar and AP Research courses at the High School and I had a great opportunity to participate as a panelist for their research defenses, which brought back both scary and positive memories of my own dissertation defense. I was super impressed with the research that the students had done which ranged from doing correlation studies between common ingredients in common foods and diseases such as heart disease and diabetes to understanding the eating preferences of the lanternfly and economic impacts of that. This program continues to grow. Currently, we have 25 students in the pre-requisite seminar course and that AP Research Capstone course will have as many as 25 students in it next year. It is truly a tremendous opportunity for students, as high school students, to get that experience with the scholarly research process. I can tell you that I did not have that experience and, in reality, I didn't truly get it until I did my dissertation. This is a tremendous advantage for our students and, I think, a great example of some of the innovative and rigorous coursework that we're offering to our students at Holmdel High School.

One additional update is I had the privilege of attending Village School's annual Arbor Day ceremony. It could not have been a better day for it, at least at that point in time. The sun was shining beautifully and Mrs. Barrett and Mrs. Farese did an absolutely outstanding job in putting together the ceremony. We were very proud to welcome a number of dignitaries to join in the ceremony including our County Commissioner, Ross Licitra, of the County Shade Tree Division, Deputy Mayor Rocco Impreveduto was present, Board President Reddy was in attendance, as well as HFEE Co-Chair Michelle Sottile and Assistant Superintendent Mr. Howard joined us. Commissioner Licitra mentioned that this was the best and most well-put together Arbor Day ceremony that he's seen. He said he's been to some schools and the kids grab a shovel and we stand around a tree. He said this one was outstanding and he hopes he can come back to this one here at Holmdel's Village School every year. Mr. Reddy can talk about it, each grade performed a song and nothing brightens your day like watching the little ones singing a song or even doing some raps. They did a couple of tree raps which were a real hoot so I was proud to be there and proud of our students for that.

The final piece, and President Reddy, I just want to understand if you'd prefer for me to put this in my report or whether you want to save it for New Business for discussion which would be the School Performance Rankings.

Mr. Reddy stated that he would like to have it under New Business so they can have a full Board Discussion about it as it is a popular topic right now and Dr. Cascone said that he will be prepared to facilitate.

Mr. Reddy referenced that Village has been doing the Arbor Day Ceremony since 2013 and this was the first tree ceremony that he's been to. He shared that one class from each section (1st, 2nd, 3rd) did a song, a poem and a tree rap. It was cute because supposedly there was a competition to see which class would get to go outside to perform. Mr. Reddy shard that the ceremony reminded him of Mr. Sockol because he would go every year, that was his thing, he was very much into it and it felt like he was watching down, which was nice.

Dr. Cascone also mentioned that Commissioner Licitra presented the school with a framed Arbor Day Proclamation to commemorate the day's event and provided tree saplings for the student performers to take home.

O. Old Business

- Mr. Wall referenced the status/updates regarding the following:
- A) 2023/2024 Budget update regarding the Township providing any PILOT funding. Dr. Cascone responded, sharing that the district's proposed 23/24 budget utilizes banked cap, specifically to fund courtesy bussing and the expenditures for school security (SRO and SLEO-III officers). The District and Township have been in collaborative conversations regarding the prospect of sharing PILOT revenue as well as the Township taking responsibility for school security. To date, the district has not received an update on that, noting the Township's budget timelines differ from the district, so the conversations remain collaborative and we're hopeful and there is promise, if not for this budget cycle, then certainly for the future. Mr. DiMare inquired if the PILOT funds were the only thing we are looking at as far as getting the budget down. Dr. Cascone responded that based upon some of the exponential increase in costs, we looked for, and found, some significant savings and efficiencies, most notably in nine retired positions, we've been able to find a way to, backfill those with existing staff and that translated into savings. There were other ways we realized efficiencies, for example, utilizing \$1 million in maintenance reserve. Dr. Cascone shared that if we were trying to recoup savings anywhere other than through potential collaboration with the Township, we would be cutting into people and programs, at that point. Mr. DiMare inquired about transportation costs and whether this is just going to be accepted as the 'new normal' and asked if there has been any additional information from the state. Dr. Cascone responded that the advocacy with the legislature is ongoing. The New Jersey Association of School Administrators continues to actively engage in advocacy at the state. The state did provide some financial relief to those districts that were hit most significantly by the changes. Those were districts that were on the other side of the S2 legislation. We did discuss a tangent of that, at our last Committee of the Whole meeting, when discussing combining start times at the Middle School and the High School, with the understanding that there are additional hoops that would need to be cleared in order to do that, but that could potentially be a savings of approximately \$500,000-\$800,000 in annual transportation costs, so that is one option on the table. In speaking with Mr. Petrizzo and our Transportation Department, Dr. Cascone shared that we're certainly not expecting any increases like we've seen, it seems to have, stabled out and tapered off in terms of the increase. If we see inflation come down and fuel costs come down, that will certainly impact this positively. One final piece, there continues to be advocacy to, loosen the certification requirements for bus drivers to remove the "under the hood" assessment which really removed a lot of people from the pool. The transportation companies have had to really bring their wages up to be competitive with retaining and attracting drivers so if there are more potential candidates in the pool, that salary piece will stabilize.
- B) RFP Update/Timeline. Dr. Cascone responded that, at a previous board meeting, we did have a resolution approving moving forward with RFPs for contracted services. Mr. Petrizzo and the Business

Office have put together that processing timeline with the advertisement for RFPs taking place on April 25th, RFP responses are due to the district on May 15, 2023. That will be just in time for the May 17th Committee of the Whole Meeting at which the Board will review the RFP responses. On June 21st, we will have interviews, if applicable, as well as final discussions at the Committee of the Whole Meeting. At the June 28th Board Meeting, we foresee approving the selected contracted service providers.

- C) Energy Update, Mr. Wall thanked Administration for analyzing the three (3) different energy options referencing the trigger resolution that was approved tonight.
- Mr. Reddy provided additional comments regarding the budget and the request to the Township to provide some sort of relief, whether that be PILOT funding or funding for school security. Mr. DiMare inquired what the increase would be if the Township didn't charge us \$250k for SRO/Class III services. Mr. Petrizzo advised him that Banked Cap would decrease to \$500k and the overall increase would be 3.46%.
- Mr. Reddy stated that the next meeting of the Board will be Wednesday, May 3, 2023 for the formal adoption of the 2023/2024 Budget.
- P. <u>New Business</u>
 - Mr. DiMare referenced the previous topics discussed regarding tenured and non-tenured staff and thanked Dr. Cascone for taking the time for healthy conversation and discussion, sharing that the issue was more on vision and strategy, not personnel. The Board is going to be pushing to raise the bar here in Holmdel. He feels the district is moving in the right direction, however, there is a tremendous amount of work to do and there is also a tremendous amount of opportunity to do well and do better here in Holmdel. Let's get it done to enhance our student's educational experience and best prepare them for this ultra-competitive world.
 - Dr. Cascone referenced the school rankings that were released by NJ.com and shared that the release of the school rankings was news to all. No advance notice was provided to school districts or even the County Superintendent, that the practice was coming back into play or that they would be released. Dr. Cascone shared that they are trying to make complete sense of the rankings. In speaking with a contact, who sits on the Executive Committee at the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, it's now come to light that there are flaws in the metric, particularly for the high school ratings, but what those are and how they impact things, remains to be seen. It's just another example of the State Department of Education not acting in good faith and then, on top of that, putting out a metric that's not reliable or valid, necessarily, like they did in putting out an unreliable and invalid test with the NJGPA, and then asking us to communicate it. Dr. Cascone stated that we're hopeful that it will be a more reciprocal partnership moving forward. These rankings are based exclusively on the district's performance on the New Jersev Student learning Assessment as well as chronic absenteeism and also ELL (English Language Learners) performance (ELL applies to Indian Hill only). The way this lays out is congruous with the student achievement data that was presented earlier in the year when we got our New Jersey Student Learning Assessment data which is the data from administration of the test last year, and more notably, it was the first time the test had been administered since before the pandemic. Not only did the State Department of Education not tell us they were doing it, they also decided to restart the ranking approach with one year of data that was coming immediately after a pandemic. It's also interesting that chronic absenteeism is also included in the metric for a school year, the better part of which, they were requiring students to stay home from school for 10 days at a time when being guarantined. You would

think they wouldn't add chronic absenteeism into the metric until the year after the pandemic when students were not required to stay home for 10 days. Let's look at it, let's use it to have informative conversations and let's understand the limitations and some of the inconsistencies that exist with the way it's been calculated and some of those contextual factors. Dr. Cascone shared Holmdel High School's current school ranking (No. 83) and shared that it's up 8 spots from 2017 but one must also note that the top 22 schools on the list are magnet schools, so that would put Holmdel up further on the list amongst comprehensive high schools. It is also important to note that, through our collective efforts, Holmdel is sending 50% less students to vocational schools from this current 8th grade class compared to the previous year. Dr. Cascone said it speaks to, perhaps, a renewed confidence and faith that people have that the district is moving in the right direction and offers the right type of academic programming.

- Mr. DiMare provided comments regarding the state and the confusion they are creating. Dr. Cascone responded. Mrs. Tuccillo and Mr. Reddy provided comments. Mrs. Zhang asked how the state assessed performance standards. Dr. Cascone responded. Dr. Collur stated if we didn't believe in what the state is using to assess/measure, we should develop our own standards to assess achievements. Dr. Cascone responded.
- Mr. Reddy referenced the Superintendent's evaluation that needs to be completed prior to July 1st. He stated that he is working with Mary Ann Friedman, our NJSBA Field Rep., who will assist with this process and will be attending the May 17th Committee of the Whole Meeting to review the process with the Board. Dr. Cascone will first provide the Board with the Superintendent's Self Evaluation and then the Board will meet (without Dr. Cascone) to discuss and complete the evaluation to be submitted to the County prior to the deadline.
- Mr. DiMare inquired about next Wednesday's meeting and Mr. Reddy and Mr. Petrizzo explained that the next Board meeting will be for the public hearing and approval of the 2023/2024 Budget. Mr. DiMare then asked when the next Committee of the Whole meeting would be for discussion regarding curriculum and Mr. Reddy and Dr. Cascone confirmed that would be at the May 17th Committee of the Whole meeting.
