# A. Call to Order

The Board of Education, Township of Holmdel, met in a Committee of the Whole Meeting on Wednesday, February 19, 2025 at Holmdel High School, 36 Crawfords Corner Road, Holmdel, New Jersey. The meeting was called to order at 6:02 p.m. by Mr. DiMare, Board President.

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#### L. Board Sub Committee Report

<u>Curriculum & Instruction</u> – Mrs. Tuccillo reported that C&I will meet after the budget process is complete and shared that, in the meantime, she is working on preparing a list of topics of interest and they will refocus on C&I in the spring.

<u>Public Relations</u> – Mr. Libecci shared the first newsletter was a great success with over 5,000 views. The newsletter is for informational purposes, to share good news and meeting highlights. Informational articles will also be published each month featuring important topics to educate the public.

<u>Labor Negotiations/Personnel</u> – Mr. Buckley shared that Committee and HTEA met on February 18<sup>th</sup> and had a productive session. Proposals have been exchanged and the next meeting is scheduled for March. The Committee will review the HTEA's proposal in advance of that meeting, working diligently to develop a new agreement that is mutually beneficial to all parties.

<u>Budget & Finance</u> – Mrs. LoPresti shared there is a budget review meeting scheduled for 3/11. Mrs. LoPresti read a prepared statement outlining budget challenges. Mr. DiMare elaborated on Mrs. LoPresti's overview regarding financial challenges. Mr. Reddy referenced PILOT funds, reserves being exhausted and courtesy bussing vs. staff/class sizes. Mr. DiMare defined courtesy bussing.

<u>Policy</u> – Mr. DiMare shared the new NJSBA Policy Manual needs approval and shared that the Committee will be meeting next week.

Dr. Cascone shared the Waiver Data Update Presentation and provided a thorough recap of the February 14<sup>th</sup> parent presentation with additional input from Mrs. Killean, Mrs. Wrubel, Dr. Arciero and Mrs. Lotter.

#### O. Questions or Comments from the Public

Mrs. Cunningham, parent, referenced courtesy bussing/PILOT and will encourage community members to attend next Township meeting. She stated she spoke to the former Mayor Impreveduto regarding safe walkways and plans to follow up with current Township Administration. She shared she is happy with the cafeteria changes and health & wellness improvements. Mrs. Cunningham supports The Balance Project and shared that PreK was play based and utilized a wonderful program called Tools of the Mind. She thanked the Board for their commitment of daily time and effort.

Mr. Shikhanovich, referenced courtesy busing and issues with safety, traffic and excessive vehicles. Mr. Trent provided a detailed explanation of the courtesy busing guidelines as mandated by the State. Mr. Shikhanovich referenced his recent experience finding a daycare that was play-based and the more time kids spend playing together, the better and feels that screen time is an issue in itself.

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Mrs. Chen, parent, shared that she appreciates the acknowledgement that students on the cusp deserve a second look, which is critical for their success given that 75% of placement criteria is based on standardized testing. She referenced the MAP assessment computerized adaptive test where question difficulty increases based on their answers to previous questions versus NJSLA where all students receive the exact same questions and feels that students who are not exposed to higher level material, would have a harder time achieving a higher percentile ranking to earn the full 2 points for the placement criteria and asked Administration to revisit this. She also expressed concerns with misleading information in the FAQs regarding Algebra II and SA Testing. Dr. Cascone and the Board shared that they appreciate her feedback and responded accordingly.

Mrs. Haack, parent, thanked the Board for the theater comment and shared that she fully supports The Balance Project. She appreciates the level of detail Ms. Lotter provided on Friday and asked the Board not to forget about those students who place in the advanced classes as it weighs down the content and could potentially impact those students and may decide to leave.
