Superintendent's Recommendations for Approval

New Business:

1. Testing Times Reviewed testing times for grades 1-12. Excellent information. In Summary 5th & 8th grades spend the most time testing. The high end of testing totals 3+ days (1,140 minutes/19 hours). Low end (1st grade) totals 360 minutes/6 hours).

Test include NJSS (4-12), MAP (1-6 3 times a year), Link-it (7-12), Inner Orbit (6-8), NJGPA (11th), NJSLA- ELA Spring (3-9), NJSLA – Math Spring (3-9), NJSLA Science Spring (5,8, 11)

- Satz Media Center Website website Reviewed new Satz Media Website that Dr. S.Tetreault oversaw & is managing.
- 3. Learning Center update Received update on the learning programs that have been going on for the last few months. Have made great progress as 31 of 46 students are now passing. This program has literally saved a number of students who were in a very bad spot. Great success story. Plan is to keep this program in place so we can continue to help students who are struggling.
- 4. **Ready Math pilot:** Indian Hill i-Ready data_Long discussion on Ready Math pilot. 4-6th grade. 2 teachers per grade. I-Ready shows if meeting grade level. MAP shows if students are exceeding grade level. Discussion to continue on this topic as we get additional feedback from all stakeholders.
- <u>5.</u> Linkl!t parent letter (Fingertip Report) Letter Link-it letter sent to all parents. If there are questions parents are urged to contact building principals so they can discuss their child's results.
- 6. **Best Elementary Schools in Monmouth Co.** (<u>Link</u>) Niche rated Village school was rated \$4 school in Monmouth Cty. Niche rated Indian Hill was rated #5 school in Monmouth County. Sea Girt, Roosevelt (80 students) & Spring Lake were rated #1-3. Well done Village & IH schools!

Other items to keep on the C&I Radar:

- 1. <u>School Starting Times</u> School start times discussed. Additional research to be done to see if this is something the district will seriously look into.
- 2. Class Sizes: Need to review class sizes specifically for grades K-6. Sizes were in low 20s & seems sizes may have creeped up.
- 3. SAT Scores: Need to provide average SAT scores for the district when they are announced.
- 4. **Vo-Tech acceptances:** Need to provide Board list of students who were accepted to Monmouth County Vo techs this year. Need to do compare to last 3 years so we can track the trend.
- 5. **College Acceptances:** Need to ensure the district communicates to public all the colleges our Seniors have been accepted to.
