For Children with Disabilities Birth through Age 21 In Holmdel

What is Child Find?

Child Find is an ongoing process to identify children between birth through age 21 who may have disabilities and would be eligible for early intervention services or special education and related services.

Infants and Toddlers

The NJ Early Intervention System (NJEIS) provides services for infants and toddlers, from birth to three years of age, with developmental delays and disabilities, and their families.

If you are concerned your preschool child or student is developing differently, you can call the Holmdel Township Office of Special Services at 732-946-1186.

Who may make a referral for services?

Parents may request an evaluation to determine their child's eligibility for services. However, physicians, nurses, psychologists, social workers, and others may make a referral after discussing it with parents.

What kinds of services are available for children from birth through age 3?

Early Intervention Services are provided to children:

- Within the family's routine;
- Within their natural environments (the home and community);
- In settings which children without disabilities participate;
- and with active participation of families

What kinds of services are available for children with disabilities ages 3-21?

A free, appropriate public education (FAPE) may include services such as supplementary aids and services or specialized instruction within the general education class or through a resource program or special class in or out-of-district.

How are the services determined?

An individualized services program (IFSP) for infants and toddlers is developed by the parents and early intervention professionals.

An individualized education program (IEP) is developed for students with disabilities ages 3-21 by the parents, child study team members and teacher. The IEP includes goals and objectives and describes the nature of the program and services to be provided.
