

The Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act

- Every year, school districts **must report bullying incidents** to the New Jersey Department of Education (by October 31st).
- The NJ DOE gives each school district and each school in the district **a grade** on how the school district or school is carrying out the requirements of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights.
- Grades are based on a self-assessment/rubric completed by the School Safety Teams in each school to ensure implementation of the law.
- o In order for a school to submit assessment results to the NJDOE by the prescribed due date, the Self-Assessment results must be approved by the **district BOE** at either the September or October BOE meeting.

UNDERSTANDING SELF ASSESSMENT •

Understanding the Self-Assessment:

The purpose of the assessment is to grade each public school and the school district's efforts in implementing the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) during that school year (our programs, processes & training).







Understanding the Self-Assessment:



Under the NJDOE's Program, each school's grade is a raw score of data and the sum of the ratings for all indicators within each core element on the School Self-Assessment (ex: 70 out of 78 points).

The maximum total score for a school is **78 points**. A minimum score of 54 is needed in order to meet all necessary requirements. The school district's grade is an average of the total scores of all schools within the school district.

Core Element #1: HIB Programs, Approaches or Other Initiatives

INDICATOR	RATING CATEGORY
Indicator A	The school annually established HIB programs, approaches or other initiatives.
Indicator B	The school annually implemented and documented HIB programs, approaches, or other initiatives
Indicator C	The school annually assessed HIB programs, approaches or other initiatives.
Indicator D	The school's HIB programs, approaches or other initiatives were designed to create school-wide conditions to prevent and address HIB
Indicator E	The school safety/school climate team (SS/SCT) identified patterns of HIB and reviewed school climate and school policies for the prevention of HIB





Location of HIB Incidents



Verbal:


(Offensive comments or text messages, mocking, taunting, teasing, name calling, posting or spreading rumors, and demeaning gestures)
